Call for Workshops and Tutorials

Proposals are solicited for Workshops and Short Courses/Tutorials as part of the events associated with the 2005 IEEE Computer Vision and Pattern Recognition Conference (CVPR '05) in San Diego, CA, June 20-26, 2005.

Workshop Proposals. Appropriate subjects for workshops include topics from computer vision as well as topics from related fields or application areas. The main criteria for workshop selection will be the appeal to a large enough cross-section of the community to make it worth doing and that the organizers have sufficient credentials to warrant the success of the workshop. Workshops will be held on June 20, 21, 25 and 26, 2005. As in recent CVPRs a passport system will be used. This means that room, coffee breaks and A/V equipment are taken care off and also that there is no separate budget for workshops. Workshop proceedings will appear on the conference CD-ROM and be indexed in IEEExplore.

1. Title/Topic and sample call for papers
2. Names and emails of organizers
3. Proposed length of workshop
4. Program committee, preliminary is ok
5. Relationship to previous workshops, if any
6. Estimated attendance
7. Date restrictions on when the workshop should be held, if any
8. Special space or equipment requirements, if any

Topics of interest to new faculty in computer vision, such as designing a vision course, setting up a lab or writing grant proposals are also welcome. Short Courses/tutorials will take place on June 20 and 21, 2005.

To propose a short course or to obtain more information, please send e-mail to Bruce Maxwell (see contact info below). A proposal should include at least the following information.

1. Title/Topic
1. Proposer's name, email, and institution
2. Proposed length of tutorial (half day/full day)
3. Names of other contributors, if any
4. Brief description of content, 1-2 paragraphs
5. Relationship to previous courses, if any
6. Intended audience and estimated attendance
7. Date preferences, if any
8. Special space or equipment requirements, if any
